

Will of William Gatfeild (- 1684)
Sutton, Stanton Harcourt, Oxfordshire

In the name Amen

I Will. Gatfeild of Sutton in the parish of Stanton Harcourt within the County of Oxon yeom. And being in perfect sense and memory thank be given to god but not in health of body having a mind to dispose of that estate wherewith god hath bless me doe make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following.

First I bequeath my soule to god that gave it hoping for salvation in and through the merits of my lord & saviour Jesus Christ my body I committ to the Earth from whence it came to be buried in Christian buryall at the discretion of my executor hereafter named. And as for my worldly estate I thus dispose of itt.

I give unto my sone James Gatfeild tenn pounds being the money and bonds he hath already had of me.

I give unto my daughter Jane Sharman sixtie pounds to be payed within one yeare after my decease and if it my daughter dye within the year then the sixty pounds to be equally divided amongst her children.

I give unto John gatfeild my grandsonne a hundred pounds to be payed him within one yeare after my decease and if he dye within the yeare then the hundred pounds to be equally devided amongst his brothers but if my grandsonne be marryed at my decease then the hundred pounds to be at his dispose although within the year.

I give unto thomas gatfeild sonne of tho gatfeild tenn pounds.

Also I give more unto my daughter Jane Sharman the star cow and her calf if she hath any then.

All the rest of my estate goods chattls and moveabls whatsoever I give unto my sonne tho gatfeild whome I make and apoynt executor of this my will and testament witness my hand and seale this twenty ninth day of march one thousand six hundred eighty three.
